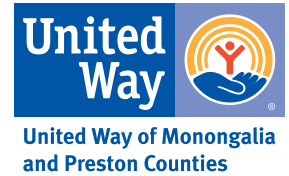


FAST FACTS

INVOLVEMENT

In 2018, 2,433 volunteers donated time and talent through VolunteerMPC, a responsive website allowing individuals to find volunteer projects that fit their passion.

EFFICIENCY

United Way MPC has received Charity Navigator's 3-Star Rating and the Guide Star Silver certification. The administrative rate of 11.2% is significantly lower than the average of 35% recommended by the Charities Review Council.

RESULTS

United Way and its funded partners are working to address the needs in the three impact areas of Health, Education, and Financial Stability.

- About 32,480 weekend food packs were sent home to school children in 2018
- A \$7,721.22 Federal Furlough burden grant went to Mon and Preston County pantries
- 3,452 individuals have been impacted by early literacy/education initiatives

The Family Resource Network program coordinates the Monongalia Food and Hunger Committee, consisting of the 12 food pantries in Monongalia County. In 2018, 36,417 individuals visited pantries in Monongalia County.

Funding supports 46 programs at 24 health and human service agencies in Monongalia and Preston counties.

RESOURCES

United Way MPC generated \$1.3 million through its annual campaign in 2018. An additional \$300,000 was generated in grants and sponsorships and other revenue, resulting in total resources of \$1.6 million. Non-financial contributions in the form of in-kind gifts are valued at over \$152,000.
