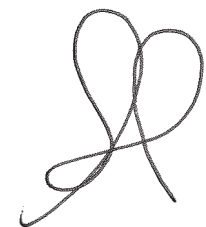

WHY GIVE TO THE UNITED WAY?

- Your gift to the United Way, combined with the generosity of others, directly benefits our community by addressing concerns and creating a lasting impact.
- The United Way works to address the needs in 4 impact areas: Youth Opportunity, Healthy Communities, Financial Security, and Community Resiliency. With your pledge we are able to fund 30 programs at 26 agencies that are directly addressing the needs in our community.
- In addition to funding local agencies, United Way runs several internal programs, including Helpful Harvest, which addresses food insecurities, Dolly Parton's Imagination Library, which promotes childhood literacy, and WV211 information and community referral hotline.
- United Way maintains an administrative overhead at 7 percent. This is a significantly lower percentage than the combined administrative costs that would be incurred if each agency did its own fundraising for programs.
